Household Chemicals

Modern household chemicals make life easier, but they do require proper use, storage and disposal. Make sure that you read all labels and use the product according to the directions. When finished with the product, make sure that you dispose of it in the appropriate manner. Household chemical products placed in the trash and then the landfill may leak out and contaminate surface and groundwater supplies.

How Do I Know If A Product Is Hazardous?

If the product label reads “use with caution,” “flammable” or “keep away from children,” it is most likely a hazardous substance. Some chemicals are more harmful than others, and the threat to human health and/or the environment is based on the specific chemical characteristics of the substances you use. If you are unsure, it is best to ask before disposing of the product. You can reach the Solid Waste Division Monday-Friday from 8 am to 5 pm at 674-8461.

We All Live Down Stream

Never pour or flush left-over chemicals or cleaners down the storm drain, sink or toilet. Storm drain water is never treated and enters local creeks and water supplies which leads to contamination. And although our waste water is treated, some chemicals withstand treatment, i.e. medicines. When in doubt, schedule a drop-off.

Household Hazardous Waste Safe Substitutes

Ammonia-Based Cleaners	Sprinkle BAKING SODA on a damp sponge. For windows, use 2 Tbs. WHITE VINEGAR to 1 quart water
Bleach	Use BORAX on all clothes or 1/2 cup WHITE VINEGAR in rinse water to brighten dark clothing
Carpet/Upholstery Cleaners	Sprinkle DRY CORNSTARCH or BAKING SODA on furniture or carpet, then vacuum it up. For stains; blot with WHITE VINEGAR in soapy water
Disinfectants	Use BORAX; 1/2 cup in a gallon of water
Drain Cleaners	Pour 1 cup BAKING SODA down drain; then 1/2 cup of WHITE VINEGAR. Wait a minute, then flush with hot water
Drain De-cloggers	Use a PLUNGER or remove and clean trap
Furniture and Floor Polish	Clean with OIL SOAP and warm water. Dry with soft cloth. Polish with 1 part LEMON JUICE to 2 parts OIL
Silver Polish	Rub gently with TOOTHPASTE and soft wet cloth
Oven Cleaners	BAKING SODA and scrub with SCOURING PADS

Scouring Cleaners and Powders	Sprinkle BAKING SODA on a damp sponge
Ant Poison	Repel ants with CHILI POWDER or TALCUM POWDER sprinkled at places of entry
Flea Repellent	Use a CITRUS-OIL spray or add a bit of BREWER'S YEAST to pet's food
Houseplant Insecticides	Spray plants weekly with lukewarm SOAPY WATER, rinse well
Mouse Poisons	Use LIVE TRAPS
Weed Killer	Cut down on weeds by HAND WEEDING
Insecticide	Drown slugs and snails by setting out a pan of WHITE VINEGAR. Spray SOAPY WATER on aphids and other garden pests
Adhesives & Glues	Use white or yellow WOOD GLUE instead of solvent-suspended glues
Furniture Strippers	Use an ELECTRIC SANDER
Stains & Finishes	Use LATEX PAINT or NATURAL PIGMENT FINISHES
