



Free Grindable Demolition Disposal

Taking advantage of the City of Sheridan's free grindable demolition debris disposal is easy. Review this checklist to make sure you've taken all the necessary steps to start your project.

Checklist

- If structure was built before 1979, call DEQ to get asbestos form and start 10-day waiting period.
- If necessary, schedule asbestos testing.
- Call MDU and City of Sheridan to turn off gas, water and electricity.
- Pick up and fill out your demolition permit application from the Building Department, expect a 1-2 business day turnaround.
- Set up a business account at the City's billing department to pay additional landfill fees (those items not covered by the City's Free Grindable Demolition, such as decommissioning refrigeration units).
- If necessary, perform asbestos abatement.
- Pick up final permit from City.
- Demolish building.
- Separate grindable from non-grindable material.
- Bring demolition permit to landfill when disposing of each load.
- Notify City Building department and landfill when project is complete.
